



HIKING TRAILS

LAKE PLACE PARK

Walking through Duluth's waterfront neighborhood will bring you to a beautiful vista point filled with artistic sculptures representing the relationship between Duluth and her sister cities from around the world. A great tour for those interested in learning more about Duluth's culture and history.

Trailhead: Follow the Lakewalk from Pier B. When you arrive at Endion Station Inn take the stairs behind the public bathroom up to the Sculpture Garden.

- Easy: paved and appropriate for wheelchairs and strollers.
- 2.5 miles
- 2 hours

MINNESOTA POINT SCIENTIFIC NATURE AREA

This freshwater sandbar, one of the longest in the world, offers shaded pathways lined with towering red and white pines. A serene stroll for nature lovers and those seeking a peaceful refuge.

Trailhead: Drive to the end of Minnesota Avenue and park in any of the spaces outside of the fencing by the airport. Trailhead is on the east side of the Sky Harbor Airport.

- Easy: starts and ends on a packed sand road, level packed trail and minimal tree roots.
- 2 miles
- 1.5 hours

TISCHER CREEK

A hidden treasure tucked into the Duluth's East Hillside, Tischer Creek gently cascades through a unique red rhyolite canyon. If you enjoy waterfalls and bridges, this is the perfect excursion for you.

Trailhead: 32nd Avenue East and Superior Street. Park along Superior Street. Trailhead is on the upper side of Superior Street opposite of Congdon School.

- Moderate: hills, stairs and uneven terrain
- 1.5 miles
- 1 hour
